The Connected Home, IoT and User State of Play series of events is targeted to meet the service provider needs within the home or business. Looking at key subjects such as:

- The Managed Wi-Fi connected premise
- User Security
- The QoE application and service driven home
- Subscriber enabled management.

Broadband Fiber Access 'State of Play' Series:

The Broadband Fiber Access 'State of Play' Series will focus on the access network and last mile connectivity of the broadband ecosystem. With focus on these suggested key discussion areas:

- Lessons learnt from current deployments within FTTP such as GPON, XGS-PON
- Advancements and future planning within FTTP technologies and optics such as 25Gig, 40Gig and 100Gig
- Fixed and mobile 4G/5G fiber aggregated services
- FTTeP fiber extended services
- Best practices with fiber service management, testing and monitoring

We are currently calling for proposals and speakers for the following Fiber Access 'State of Play' events:

- 1) April 15th 2021 "PON Deployments Reality Check"
- 2) May 20th 2021 "Future of PON Technology Update"
- 3) Fiber Access "FTTP Deployment Key Discussions Roundtable"

Network and Service Delivery 'State of Play' Series:

The final series of virtual events is focused on Cloud, Datacenter, Core and Edge functions within the broadband ecosystem. Key topics of interest, education and debate within this series include:

- The Cloud enabled central office
- Reality check and opportunities within the SDN/NFV driven network
- Virtual and disaggregated network and subscriber service delivery
- The wireless and wireline converged network
- The open standards and open source driven network
